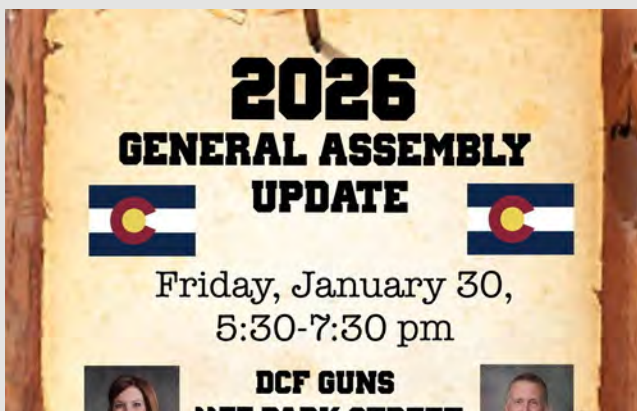
Democrats' "Affordable Housing" Plan Sounds Good, but the Policy Tells a Different Story

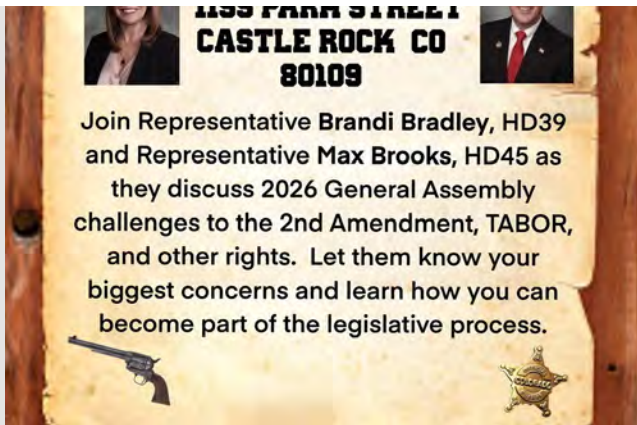
