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Defending the Second Amendment While the Legislature Expands Government Seizure Power

Colorado is moving closer to expanding Red Flag firearm seizures, and I want you to understand exactly what that means for your rights and your family.

In this article, I explain why Douglas County has carried out zero Red Flag confiscations, what actually happened during debate on the House floor this past week, and how recent legislation shifts power away from due process and toward government seizure authority without a criminal conviction.
